The annual number of legal and illegal migrants to the United States grew rapidly in the mid-1990s, peaked by the late 1990s, then declined substantially after 2001. Immigration levels in 2004 are comparable with those of the mid-1990s and still significantly below the peak levels of 1999 -2000 (Passal and Suro 2004; U. S. Citizenship and Immigration Services n. d.). Key United States population trends over the past century are identified in Markham and Steinzor (2006): Population growth: U. S. growth is higher than other industrialized nations at a current annual rate of slightly less than 1 (Population Reference Bureau 2005). Population density: U.
